Projects on the ICIP that may get funded include communication equipment and defibrillators, the OAP may get 4 vehicles and Belen may get money to address the flooding in that area.

Mr. Gabe Luna stated that he will be coming before the board at the next meeting with a detailed report on the Code Enforcement and Planning and Zoning departments.

Chief Brian Culp stated that on March 7th there was a major fire in the county, the volunteers, command staff and career staff did a fantastic job as well as the outside agencies that were brought in to help. He stated that it was a great team effort with many of the departments within the county working together. He recognized Deputy Chief Davis, Assistant Chief Moya, Assistant Chief Gonzales, Captain Barr, Emergency Manager Gillen, Emergency Specialist Brenda Alberts, and the Senior Chaplain who were in attendance at tonight's meeting. FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND DECISION

THIS MATTER came before the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County ("the Board") on February 20, 2019, and was held pursuant to Lawrence and Katherine Jaramillo's application to uphold the Planning & Zoning (P&Z) Commission's decision to approve a request for a Zone Change from Rural Residential 2 (RR-2) to Rural Residential 1 (RR-1) on the property commonly described as Tract D, Land of Martin C Frettem; Section 20, Township 6 North, Range 2 East; also known as 6 Guinea Ln, Belen, New Mexico 87002; Zoned Rural Residential 2 (RR-2); 2.45 ac, Map 87; Filed in Cabinet L, page 560 in the Office of the Valencia County Clerk.

The Board, having considered the documents in the record before it, testimony of staff, applicants and members of the public, and argument by the parties and/or their legal representatives, **FINDS:**

Findings of Fact

1. The Planning & Zoning Commission held a public hearing on the Zone Change Application for a request to change from Rural Residential 2 (RR-2) to Rural Residential 1 (RR-1) to be able to be split into one acre lots on January 22, 2019.
2. Lawrence and Kathy Jaramillo presented to the P&Z Commission their request for a zone change.
3. For consideration to split their current 2.45 ac parcel into two separate lots of approximately 1.25 acres each.
4. Mr. and Mrs. Jaramillo said their reason for requesting the change is to be able to build homes for their children.
5. The Jaramillo's explained the splitting of the lots and plans for the homes they would like to build.
6. It was also mentioned that there was no public pushback or positive influence from the public.
7. After hearing testimony and considering the applicable law, motion made by Commissioner Baca to approve the zone change. Seconded by Commissioner McCartney. Roll call vote, Commissioner McCartney-YES, Commissioner Baca-YES, Commissioner Draskiewicz-YES, and Chair Moran-YES. Motion carries 4 FOR and 0 AGAINST.
8. Notice of the regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, New Mexico (the "Board") on February 20, 2019, at which the final hearing on the Application for a Zone Change was heard.
9. Clerk Carabajal swore in the applicants and Mr. Luna
10. Gabriel Luna presented the minutes from the Planning & Zoning hearing to the County Commissioners in hard copy.
11. Mr. Luna presented the application including the Legal Description and the approval by the Planning & Zoning Commission on January 22, 2019.



12. Mr. Luna mention that the site plan seems to show a third home on two properties however to avoid any confusion mentioned that this is just showing the acreage not a home.
13. Chairman Aragon opened the floor for comment on this item.
14. Commissioner Eaton requested to ask questions after the applicant spoke on their own behalf.
15. Mr. Jaramillo mentioned that he appreciates the consideration for a decision.
16. Chairman Aragon mentioned that no other speaker was in favor or against. He then offered Commissioner Eaton time to ask his questions.
17. Commissioner Eaton then asked Mr. Luna what the surrounding area was zoned and requested that he see a map or overlay showing existing zoning for subsequent meetings.
18. Chairman Aragon then asked if there were any other questions of the applicant or Mr. Luna. Hearing none he stated that the item was closed and the Board would make a decision at a later meeting.
19. Notice of the regularly scheduled meeting of the board of County Commissioners of Valencia County, New Mexico on March 6, 2019, at which the final decision on the Application to Request a Zone Change was published according to New Mexico Statutes and the Valencia County Interim Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance 2004-05, as amended ("Zoning Ordinance").
20. The map which was requested by Commissioner Eaton showing surrounding zoning was given to the Commissioners and was explained by Mr. Luna.
21. Mr. Luna asked for consideration of the request for a decision on ZC #2019-001. Commissioner Eaton motioned for approval and sided with the Planning & Zoning Commission's decision to affirm that decision. Seconded by Commissioner Hyder. Roll call vote. Commissioner Eaton voted yes. Commissioner Hyder voted yes. Commissioner Saiz voted yes. Chairman Carlberg voted yes. Motion carried 4-0.

Conclusions of Law

The following conclusions of law are cumulative, but are severable and independent of each other.

- A. The County is a zoning authority with the power to regulate and restrict use of land. NMSA 1978, § 3-21-1 (1995).
- B. The Board of County Commissioners is the body that exercises the powers of a county as a body politic and corporate. NMSA 1978, § 4-38-1 (1876).
- C. The Board takes notice that the Zoning Ordinance was adopted according to New Mexico statutory authority and duly recorded in the records of the Clerk of Valencia County.
- D. The Board has discretion in making zoning decisions. See *Singleterry v. City of Albuquerque*, 96 N.M. 468, 471, 632 P2d 345, 348 (1981).
- E. The proposed change is consistent with the goals, policies and any other applicable provisions of the comprehensive plan. See § 154.077 (D)(1);
- F. The proposed change is appropriate considering the surrounding land uses, the density and pattern of development in the area, any changes which may have occurred in the vicinity to support the proposed amendment and the availability of utilities and services likely to be needed by the anticipated uses in the proposed district. See, § 154.077 (D)(2);
- G. The proposed change enhances the county's protection of the public health, safety and welfare of Valencia County. See, § 154.077 (D)(3);

- H. § 154.077 Type C Procedure (Commission) (L) Written decision. Upon issuing a final decision, the commission shall promptly prepare a written decision that includes an order granting or denying the requested relief and statement of the factual and legal basis for the order, file the written decision with the county clerk, and serve a document that includes a copy of the written decision and the requirements for filing an appeal of the final decision on all those with standing and those who have requested the service, in accordance with NMSA § 39-3-1.1(B), as the same may be from time to time amended.
- I. Effective date of the decision. The effective date of decision is the date of recording of the final order or, if the decision is that no order is to be filed, the effective date of decision is the date of the letter notifying the applicant of the decision.

Decision


The Board of County Commissioners finds that the approval of this zone change alleviates difficulties or hardships due to the zoning of the land. Taking into consideration from testimony that the location of the land is in an area where development is happening and the family is planning on building and staying in the area did not interfere with surrounding properties and is consistent with the current zoning of the area. The decision by the board to change from RR-2 to RR-1 fits with the overall comprehensive plan of the area.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Planning & Zoning Commission's approval of the request for a Zone Change from Rural Residential 2 (RR-2) Zoning District to Rural Residential 1 (RR-1) for the property described as: Tract D, Land of Marlin C Frettem; Section 20, Township 6 North, Range 2 East; also known as 6 Guinea Ln, Belen, New Mexico 87002; Zoned Rural Residential 2 (RR-2); 2.45 ac, Map 87; Filed in Cabinet L, page 560 in the Office of the Valencia County Clerk.

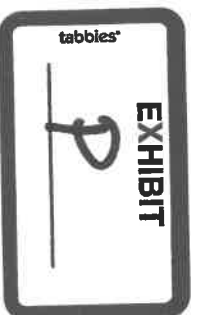


**COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT
BETWEEN VALENCIA COUNTY AND MCKINLEY COUNTY**

This Cooperative Purchasing Agreement ("Agreement") is between the County of Valencia, a New Mexico local public body, and McKinley County, a New Mexico local public body. In accordance with NMSA 1978, Section 13-1-135(A) (1999), Valencia County is authorized to enter into a governmental cooperative purchasing agreement with McKinley County. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 13-1-135(A), McKinley County may enter into a cooperative purchasing agreement with the County of Valencia, provided the governing body of each entity approves this agreement.

Valencia County and McKinley County enter into this cooperative governmental purchasing agreement to permit each party to purchase services, construction and items of tangible personal property, using the other party's competitively awarded contracts. The terms and conditions are listed below:

1. Each entity, in contracting for the purchase of services, construction and items of tangible personal property, agrees at its discretion, to extend contracts for shared use to the extent permitted by law and agreed upon by those parties and vendors.
2. Each entity shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations governing its own purchases.
3. This Agreement is expressly limited to securing legal representation to initiate an action against the Taxation and Revenue Department for unpaid gross receipts taxes. The acquisition of services made pursuant to this Agreement is not a purchase from either of the entities. This Agreement shall create no obligation to either of the parties to purchase any particular goods or services, nor create to either of the entities any assurance, warranty, or other obligation from the other party with respect to purchasing or supplying any good or service.
4. The originating contracting entity does not accept responsibility or liability for the performance of any vendor used by the purchasing entity as a result of this Agreement. No obligation, except as stated herein, shall be created between the entities, or between the entities and any applicable bidder or offeror.
5. Each entity shall be responsible for the payment of any item(s) purchased through a contract or purchase order that resulted from this Agreement. Payment must be from current revenues appropriated and available to the paying entity.
6. The term of this Agreement commences on the date of signature by authorized representatives of both entities ("Effective Date") and shall automatically renew on each anniversary date unless terminated by either entity.
7. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either entity by providing thirty



(30) days written notice of termination to the other entity's representative at the address provided below.

12. This Agreement may not be amended unless the entities execute a written amendment.

13. An approved and signed copy of this Agreement shall be filed with the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent and such other entity as may be required by the participating entity.
